TECHFEST

TechFest's STEM in the Installation Phase 4

STEM in the Installation is a team challenge (max. of **6 students per team**) for **S6** pupils. This is now translated into a fully digital project and focuses on how the Energy Industry is transitioning to reduce carbon emissions as much as possible, as part of the global movement towards net zero.

Inspired by CNOOC Internationals Buzzard Platform, students are challenged to develop a proposal to install and connect an offshore wind farm to the facility, which will generate power for the installation and reduce the amount of gas import required to provide electricity.

Throughout the course of the project students will have the opportunity to seek help and guidance from an enthusiastic team of CNOOC International volunteers who are on hand to help the students with the technical aspects of the challenge, project management, report writing and presenting.
